

The below is a list of suggestions to get the most out of your class! If you have equivalent products already, use those instead of buying new - you can always buy the products I use later if you like the look of them. Unfortunately, I won't be able to give 1 on 1 feedback on makeup kits prior to the session, but feel free to do some research and make any substitutions you need. Links are mostly to UK sites/products, so international attendees will need to find substitutions. Good luck and happy shopping!

Beauty Blender / sponge

Any sponge or beauty blender will do, you should be able to get at any Boots or Superdrug. Something like <u>this</u>

Powder puff

Big and puffy is best! Something like this .

Brush Set

Any full brush set, covering both fluffy and detailed eyeshadow brushes, a thin angled liner brush, and some bigger fluffy face brushes. Something like <u>this</u> or <u>this</u> are your cost-effective options. I love <u>Nanshy</u> brushes.

Makeup Wipes

Makeup removing wipes. Go for biodegradable to be a better human.

Elmers Purple Gluestick

Absolutely *essential* for covering brows - <u>this</u> and <u>this</u> is the only kind that will do the trick - no substitutes (if you're outside of the UK or US - search around until you find something)!

Loose Powder (translucent) -

Absolutely essential for covering brows - cheapest option I know of <u>here</u> but any loose translucent powder will do!

Cream Foundation

Ideally 3 shades - base, dark and pale/white - a cream palette like <u>this</u> or <u>this</u> will probably be the most cost effective way of doing this - you can always invest in better foundation later if this is your first drag attempt. To be even more cost-effective, if you already have a base full-coverage foundation, you could get a light / white cream foundation for your highlight and do your contouring with powder/bronzer. It really depends on your budget! On my face I use 3 Kryolan sticks, but I'd reccommend figuring out your shade before buying these if you've never done drag before.

Black Eyeliner

Any black liner - I prefer to use a gel liner, but liquid works as well if it's something you already have. I use <u>this one</u> (but it's fairly expensive!), and <u>here's a slightly cheaper option</u>. You could also use an eyeliner pen - I love <u>this one</u>

White foundation or white gel liner

We'll use this for cutting a crease and doing inner corner of eyes for a more. Use <u>this</u> <u>product</u> if you are trying to go cheaper (because it will also be useful for highlighting on your face), or <u>this one</u> is the one I use (but it's fairly expensive!)

Eyeshadow

If you don't already have eyeshadow at home, <u>this</u> or <u>this</u> will probably be your cheapest bet. Any palette / colours you like will do, but make sure you get matte eyeshadows - not shimmery/glittery. If you want to spend a bit more, I love <u>BPerfect's Stacy Marie palettes</u> - a great colour payoff

Contour/Blush/Highlight

<u>Here's</u> a good palette that does everything in one. Or if you already have a bronzer, a blush and a shimmer highlight, you're probably good to go.

<u>Mascara</u>

Any cheap Superdrug/Boots mascara will do.

Lipliner pencil

<u>Here's</u> a cheap pencil I like. Choose 1-2 shades darker than the lipstick shade you choose - I recommend nudes/ browns over bright reds/pinks for your first drag look!).

Lipstick

<u>Here's</u> a cheap lipstick I like. Any matte lipstick, preferably 1-2 shades lighter than the liner pencil.

False Lashes

Any big lashes you can find and some glue. <u>These</u> are my fave lashes, but they're not cheap. And <u>these</u> are great if you also want lower lashes as well. You may find it easier to apply your lashes with tweezers
